

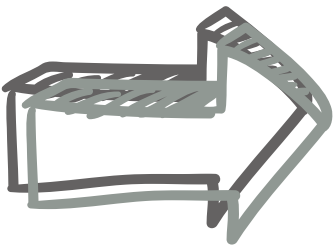

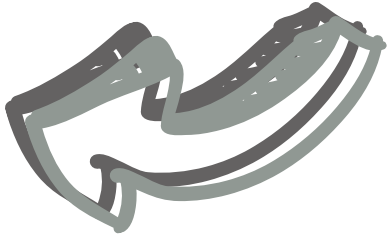
Appliance & Tire Event

SPRING REMINDERS



Road Debris - Friendly Reminder

It is a Village Ordinance (3.04a) to not deposit any foreign matter such as grass clippings & leaves on any town roads. They pose a safety concern for people on bicycles & motorcycles. It is easy to prevent the clippings from flying into the street by mowing with the discharge chute aimed back at your yard. If you don't want the clippings in your yard, just rake them up. They do add nutrients to your lawn if left alone. We understand it's inevitable that some grass will fly astray and end up on the roadway, but when there are piles, it is a blatant disregard for others' safety.

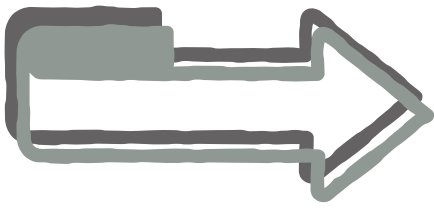

The Compost Site accepts yard waste, brush and logs. You can also pick up wood chips and compost at no charge. Those items must be hand loaded; there is no machine on site for loading.

New Resident Garbage Service

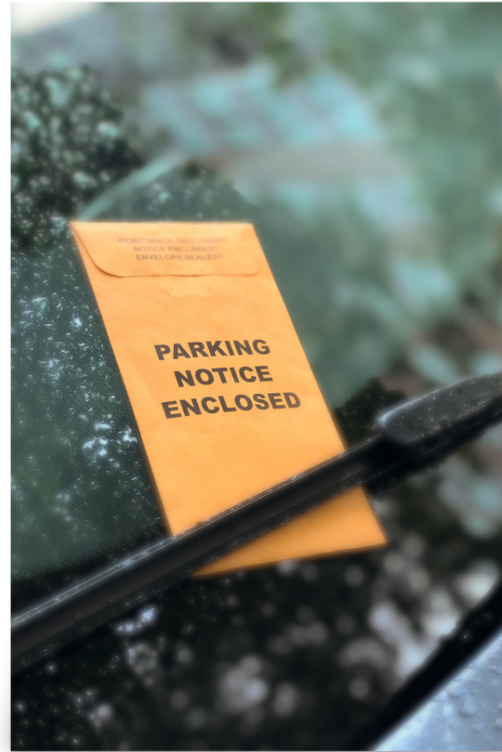
If you moved into a newly built home, please call the Village Hall at 262-246-6100 to start your garbage service. It can take up to 2 weeks for garbage service to begin. We'll confirm your occupancy date. Collection days are Monday through Thursday. Check with neighbors or call us, if you're unsure of your pickup day.



Residents are responsible for purchasing their own garbage cans; 32-gallon receptacles are best due to the 50-pound weight limit. Homeowners experience up-the-drive service; be sure your garbage cans can be lifted by a person & are also clearly visible on your pickup day by 6 AM!

The fee amount increases incrementally if paid late.



Parking Citations

Just a reminder of Lisbon's Parking regulations: overnight parking is enforced between the hours of 2AM-6AM on all public streets, highways, alleys and public right-of-ways. In case of emergency, overnight permission may be approved through the Village of Lisbon Sheriff's Deputies. Parking violations are enforced by citations in the amount of \$20.00. There are posted signs throughout the Village indicating parking regulations. There may not be a sign on your street, but the regulations still apply.

To the **CURB** and *Beyond!*

Keep storm drains clean! Grass clippings, pet waste, leaves, fertilizers, litter and other pollutants wash directly into the nearest waterbody!

To the River

Despite what you may hear in neighborhood chat groups... **separating recycling from garbage at home is very important!**

Recyclables are sorted by people and machines to make new items!

To the Recycling Facility

See it in action:

- tin cans → appliances
- milk jugs → composite decking
- plastic bottles → carpeting
- aluminum cans → new aluminum cans

The last stop! No sorting, recovery or reuse. It is a misconception that items decompose quickly.

To the Landfill

You can help keep our environment healthy. The health and quality of our recycling stream and community waterways depend upon us all making informed, environmentally friendly decisions. Do your part and be sure to **KNOW BEFORE YOU THROW!**

Help keep our local waters clean! Pollutants cause weed and algae growth in our waters leading to growth of dangerous bacteria and sediment laden muddy waters. Stop pollutants before they get to the curb or storm drain and take action to help:

- Pick up after your pet and dispose of the waste in the trash
- Sweep leaves and grass clippings out of the street and back onto your yard or compost pile
- Reduce the use of chemicals on your lawn
- Wash your car at the car wash or on the grass—not the driveway
- Fix cars that leak oil

Help keep our recycling system strong! Recycled material is sorted by people and machines. Once sorted, it is sold to a remanufacture to be turned into something new! Recycling right is important to ensuring the quality of our community's recycling stream. Items that are put in the garbage cart go directly to the landfill. It is a common misconception that items decompose quickly in a landfill. When you set materials at your curb take action to help:

- Only put trash in the trash cart. Once items are placed in the trash they are taken to the landfill and that is the end of their journey. No sorting. No recovery. No reuse. No purpose.
- Only put recyclables in the recyclables cart. Review the Waukesha County [recycling guide](#).
- Remember: When in doubt – throw it out!
- Make sure recyclables are loose in the cart and that materials are empty, clean, and dry
